

NEW TOWN HALL, Karlovo náměstí 23, Prague 2

At the northern end of Charles Square, the Prague's largest square with area of 80.000 square metres, stands the New Town Hall with its conspicuous tower. The two halls with reticulated vaulting on the ground floor are particularly remarkable. First recorded reference to it dates from the 14th century when it was already housing municipality offices as well as a prison. The two halls with reticulated vaulting on the ground floor are particularly remarkable. After the four towns of Prague were joined into one, the New Town Hall housed only the criminal court and prison. It is currently used for official functions and cultural events.
