

## ZOFIN PALACE, Slovansky ostrov 226, Prague 1

This neo-Renaissance palace was built in 1835-1837 on the Slovansky Island (originally called Dyer's Island) on the Vltava River. The hall, ideal for concerts and balls, immediately became a very important and attractive centre of cultural and social life, especially in the second half of the 19th century. Prague applauded famous composers and musicians like B. Smetana, A. Dvorak, H. Berlioz, F. Liszt, R. Wagner and others here.

Following the general reconstruction and reopening in 1994, Zofin Palace and the island are amongst the most beautiful and popular places in Prague. It provides an exclusive environment for concerts, balls, congresses, gala receptions and business events, and offers exquisite services. A part of the building is a restaurant with a garden. All rooms are air-conditioned.
